How I connect the details: Truth's points contrast her own strength and reality with men's idea that women are weaker and need to be protected.			

MAKING A CLAIM	My claim about the text:
I state a conclusion that I have come to and can support with <u>evidence</u> from the text after reading and thinking about it closely.	Truth sees women as stronger than men think they are.
