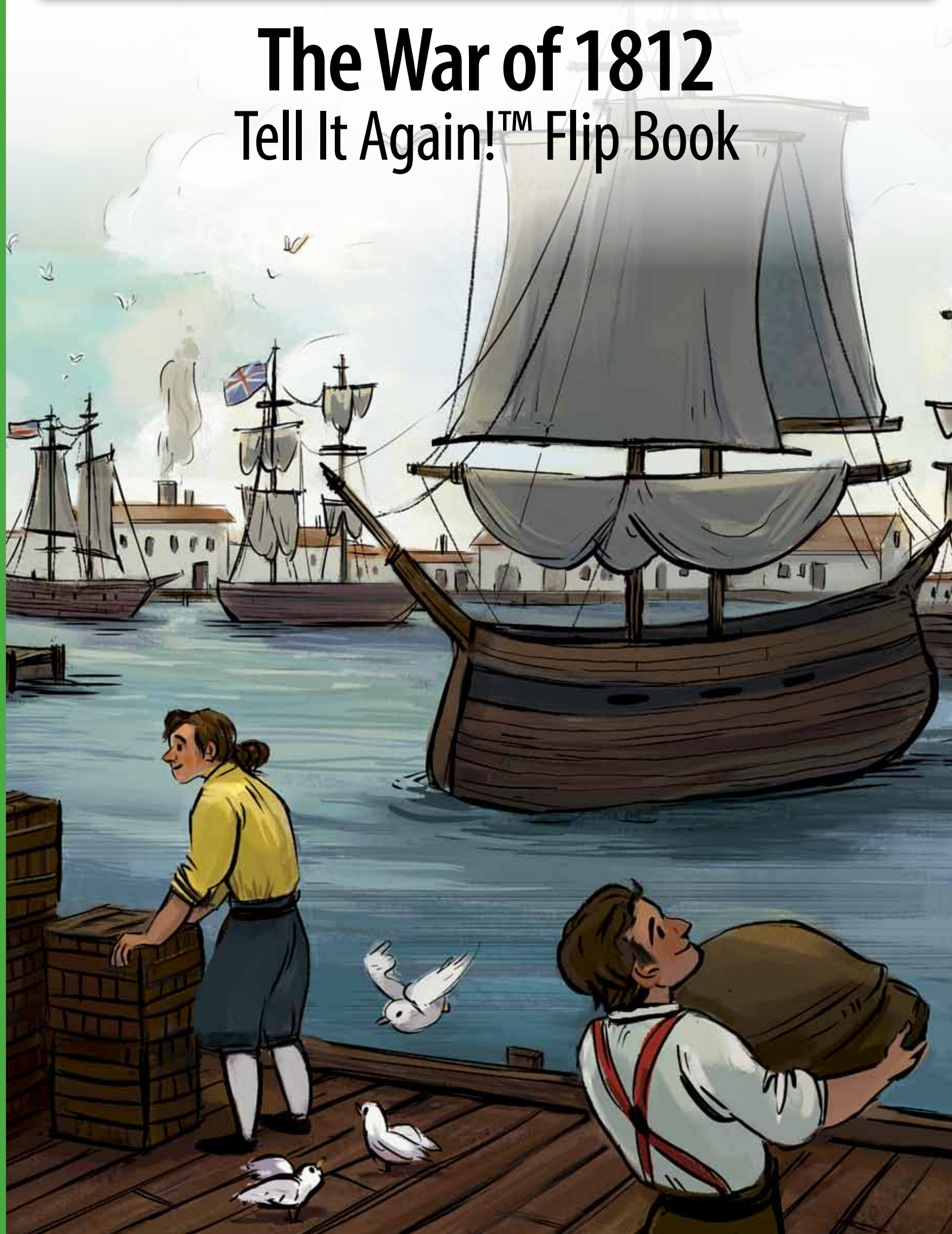

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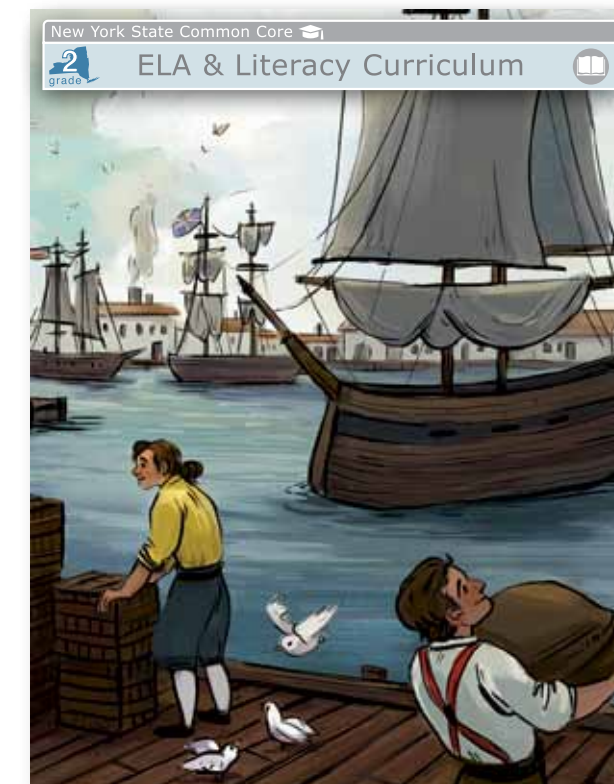
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Tell It Again! Flip Book Introduction

This *Tell It Again! Flip Book* contains images that accompany the *Tell It Again! Read-Aloud Anthology* for *The War of 1812*. The images are in sequential order. Each image is identified by its lesson number, read-aloud letter (A or B), and the number of the image within the particular read-aloud. For example, the first image in Read-Aloud 1A is numbered 1A-1. Once you have worked your way through the book to the last page, you will flip the entire book over to view the second half of the images.

Depending on your classroom configuration, you may need to have students sit closer to the flip book in order to see the images clearly.

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SCHOOLS

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WE THE PEOPLE of the United States, in order to form a more perfect Union, to insure domestic Tranquility, provide for the common defence, and our Posterity, do ordain and establish this Constitution.

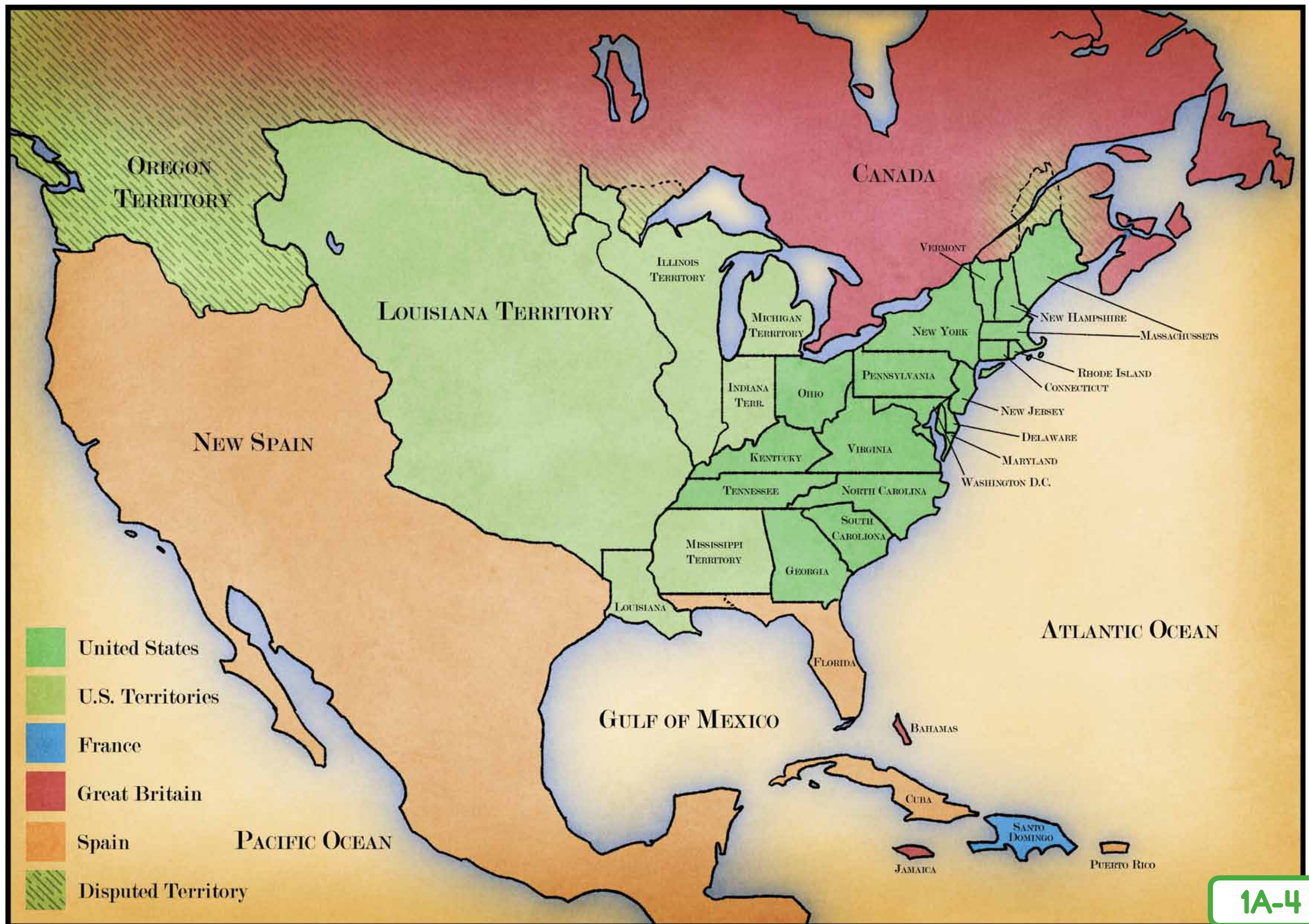
Article I.

Section 1. All legislative Powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.

Section 2. The House of Representatives shall be composed of Members chosen every second Year by the People of the several States, and in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors of the most numerous Branch of the State Legislature.

No Person shall be a Representative who shall not have attained to the Age of twenty five Years, and been seven Years a Citizen of the United States, and who shall not, when elected, be an Inhabitant of that State in which he shall be chosen.

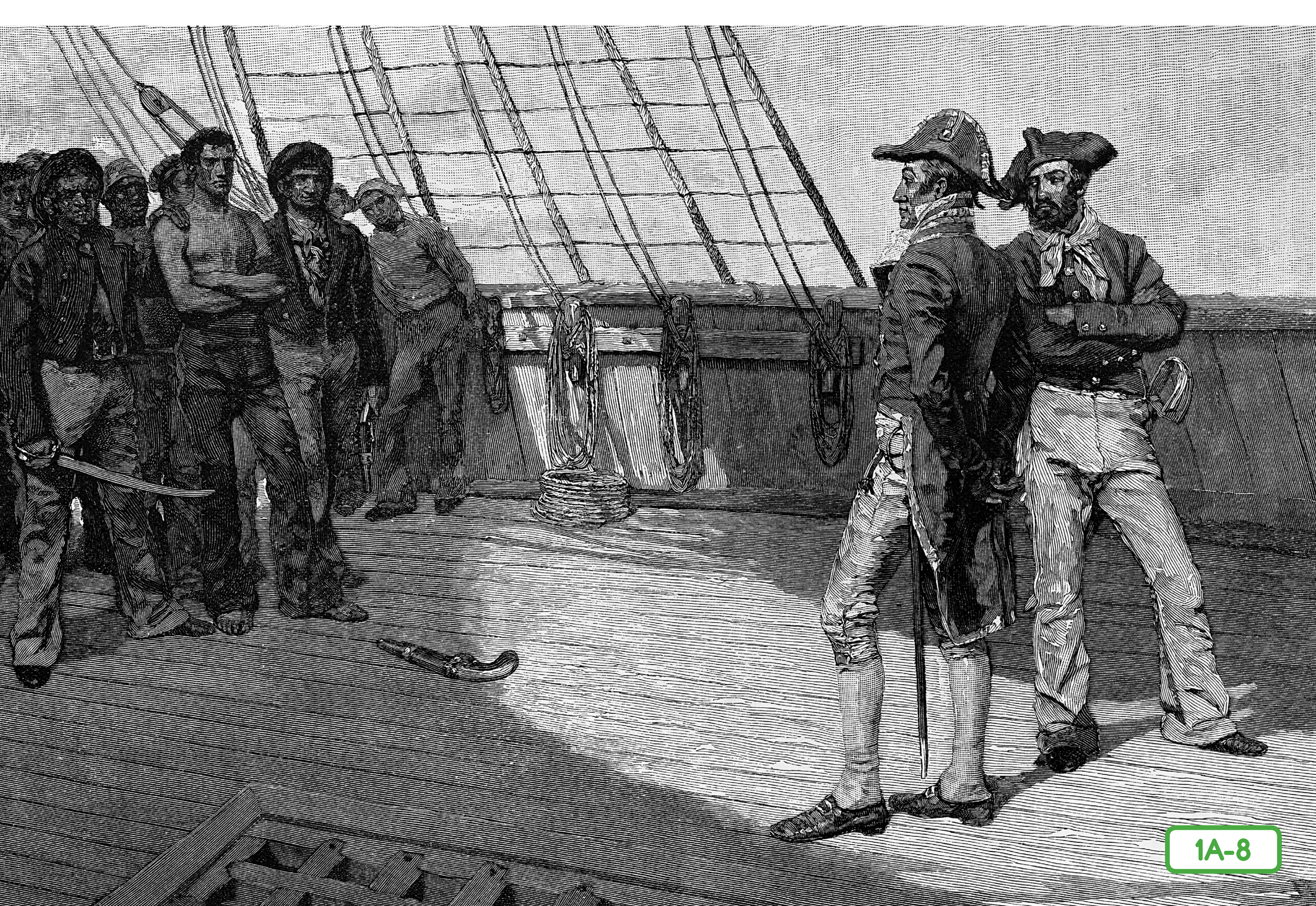
Representatives and direct Taxes shall be apportioned among the several States which may be included within this Union, according to the actual Enumeration of the People, including those bound to Service for a Term of Years, and not taxed, three fifths of all other Persons. The actual Enumeration shall be made within three Years after the first Meeting of the Congress, and within every subsequent Term of ten Years, in such Manner as they shall by Law direct. The Number of Representatives shall not exceed one for every thirty thousand, but each State shall have at least one Representative; and until such Enumeration shall be made, the State of New Hampshire shall have three, Massachusetts eight, Rhode Island and Providence Plantations one, Connecticut five, New York six, New Jersey four, Pennsylvania seven, Delaware three, Maryland six, Virginia ten, North Carolina five, South Carolina five, and Georgia three.



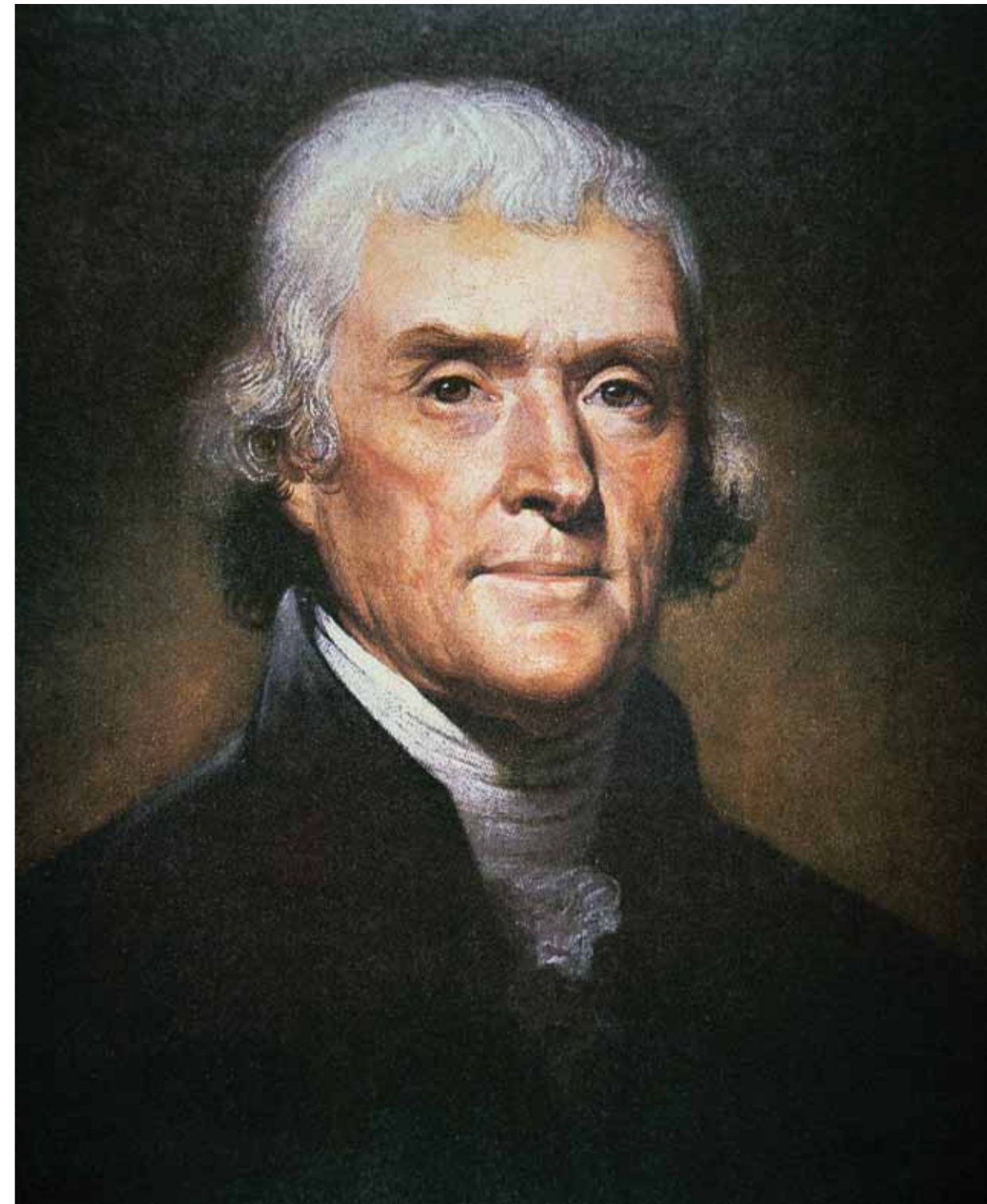
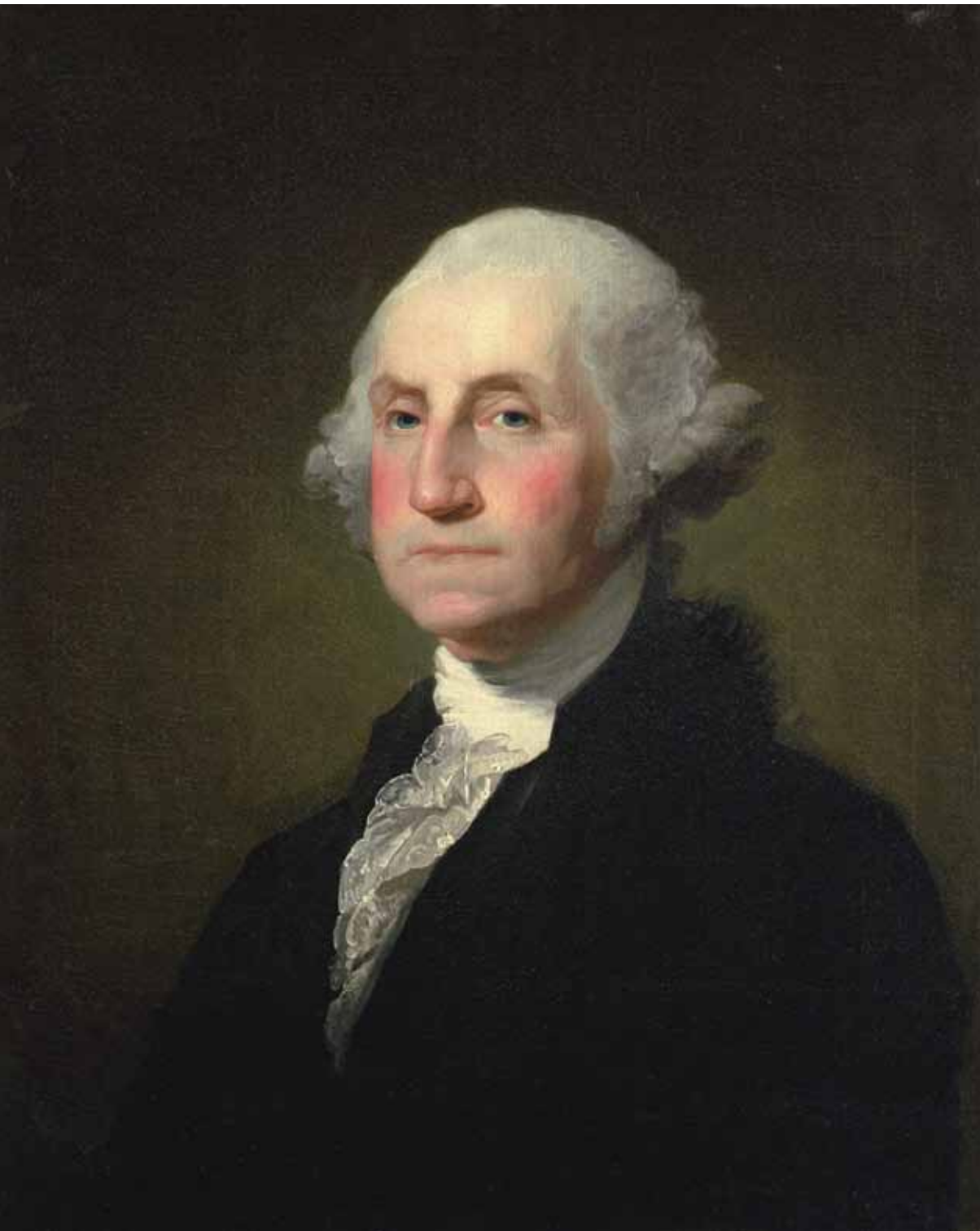








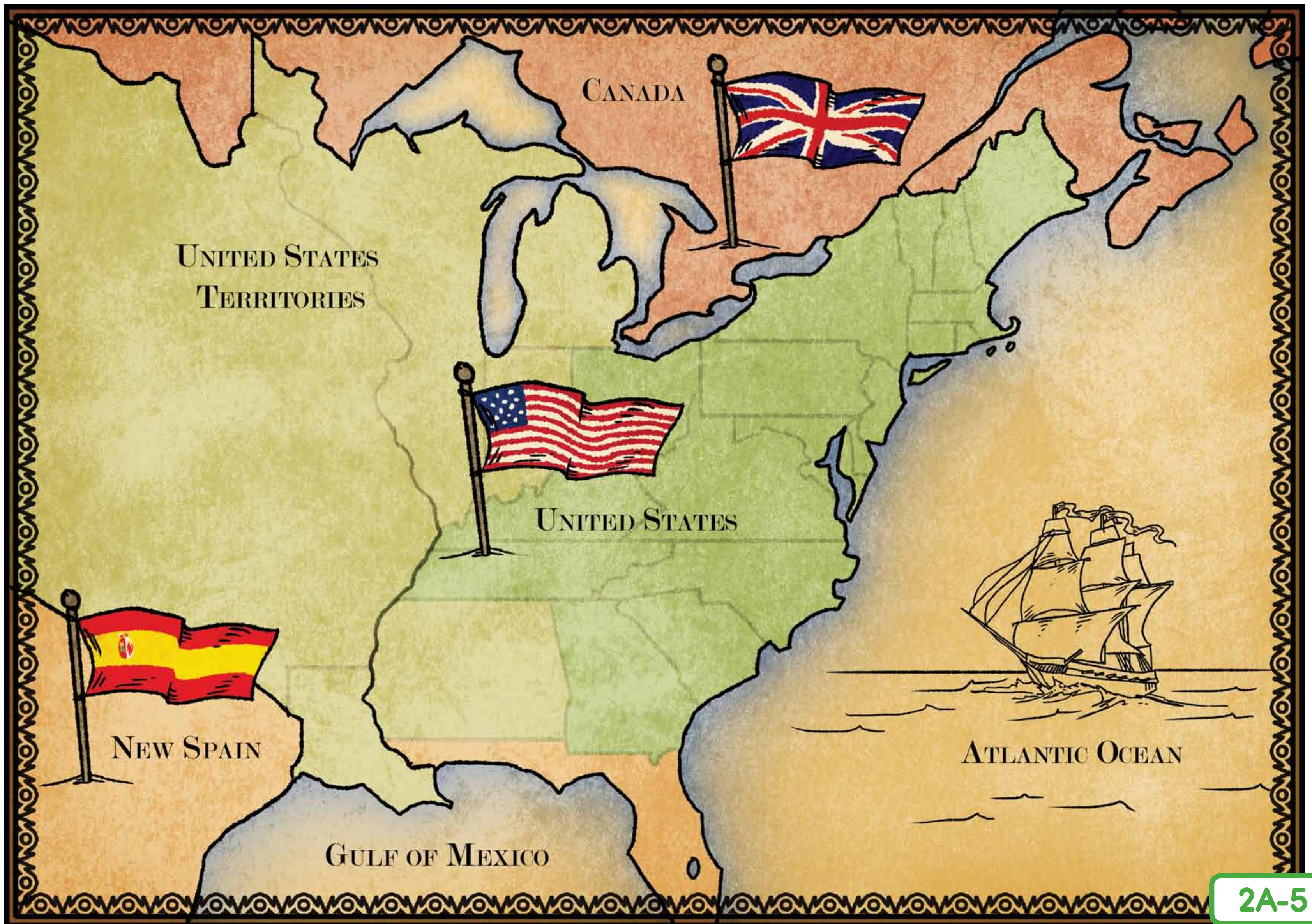




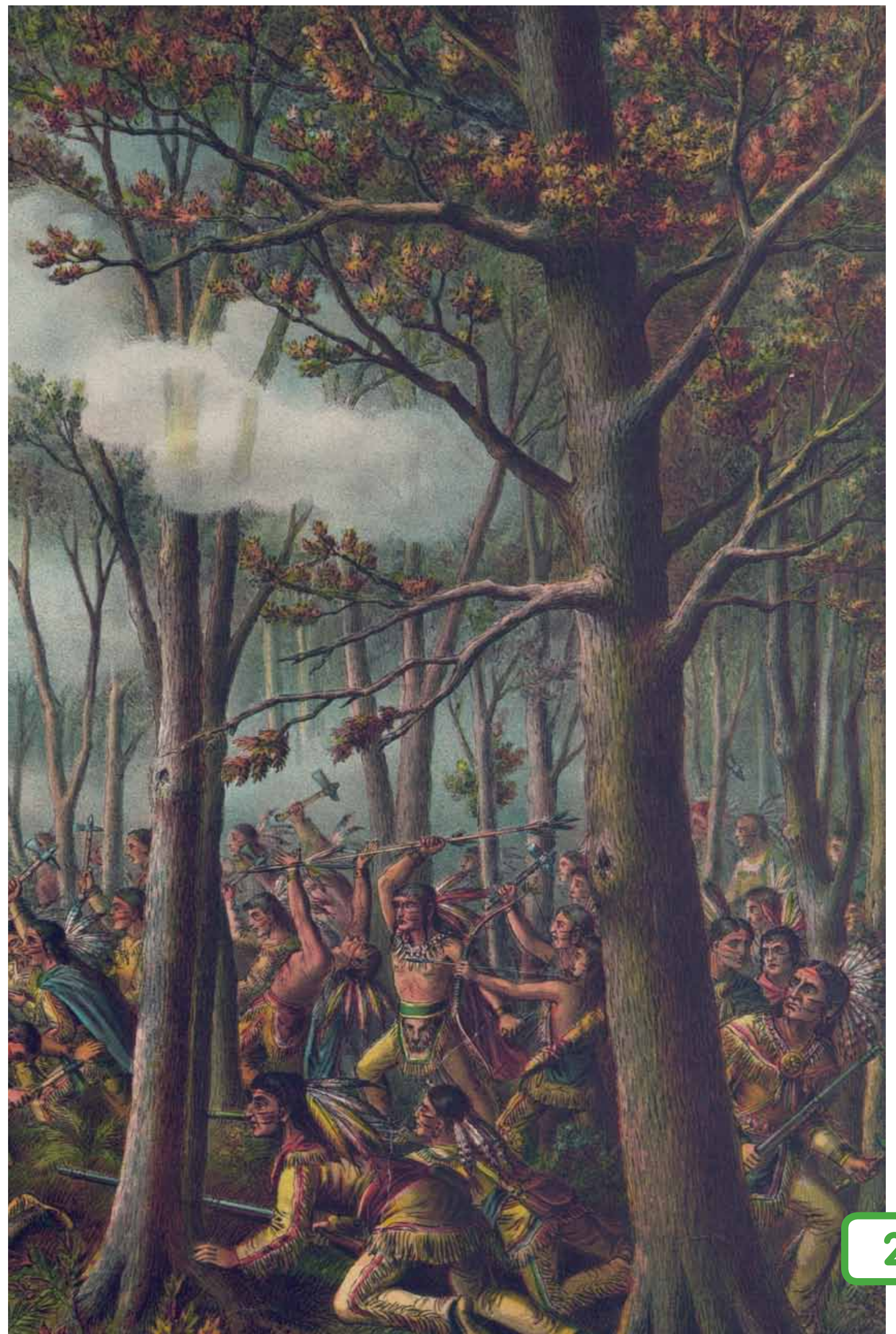
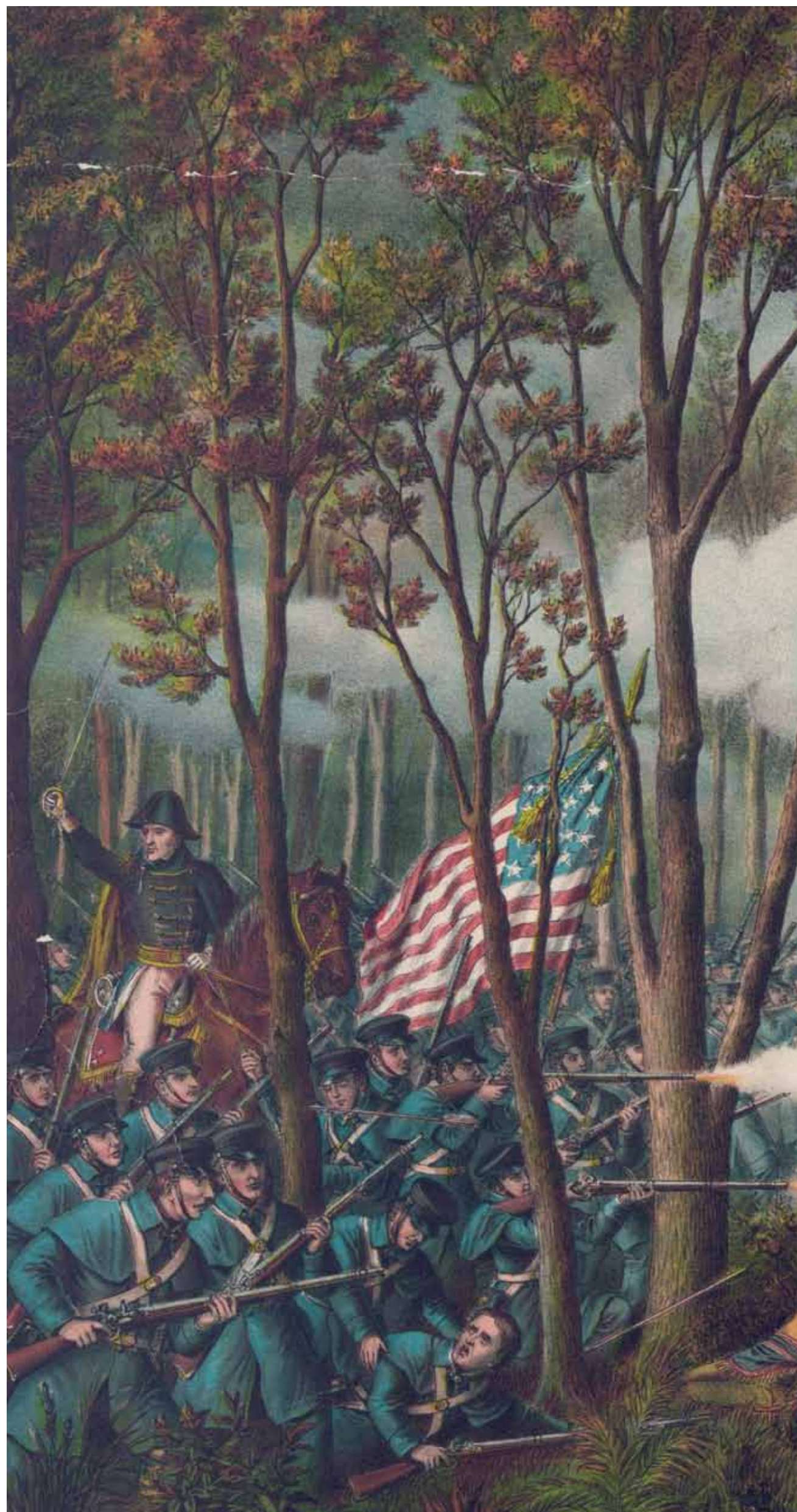


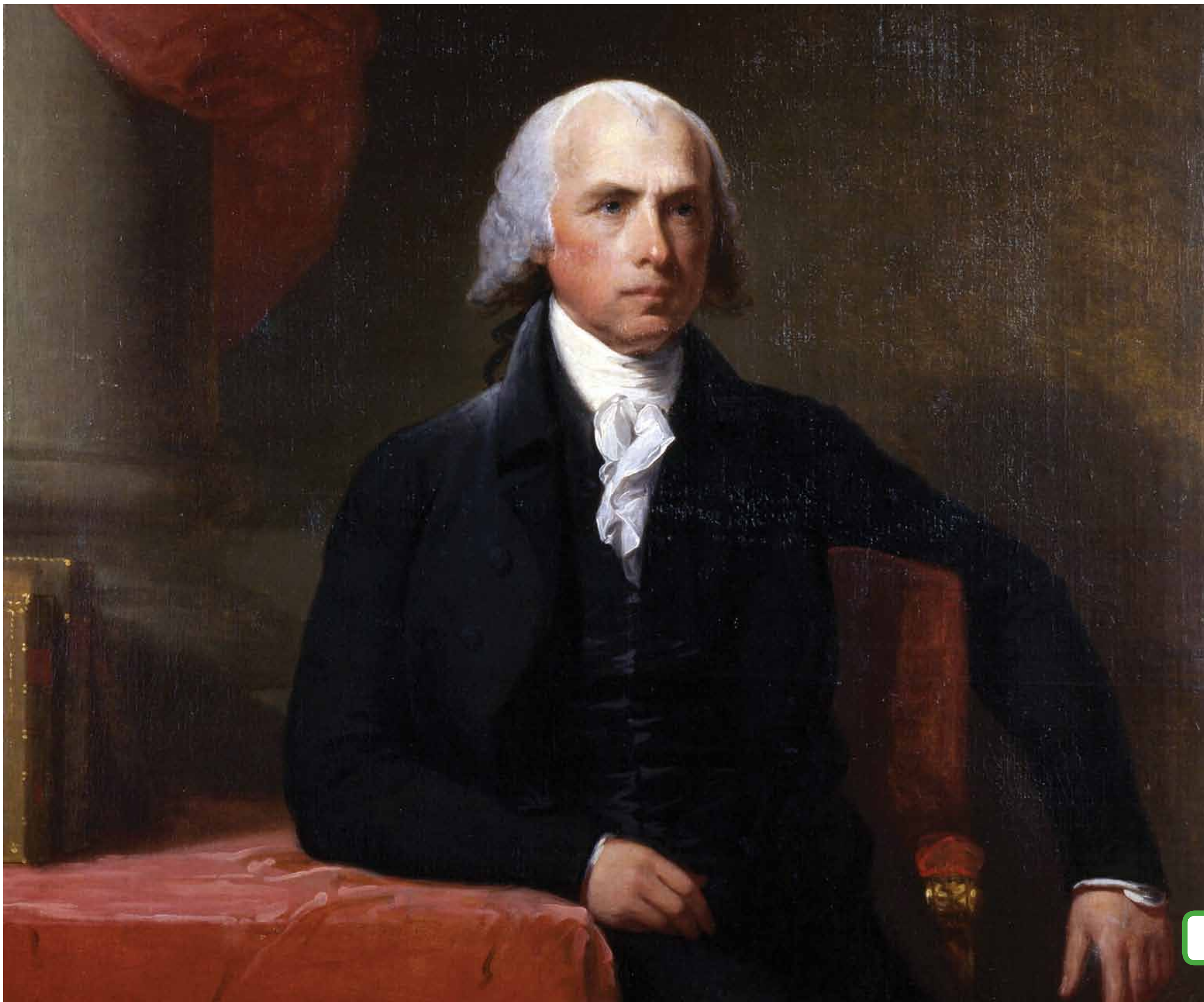














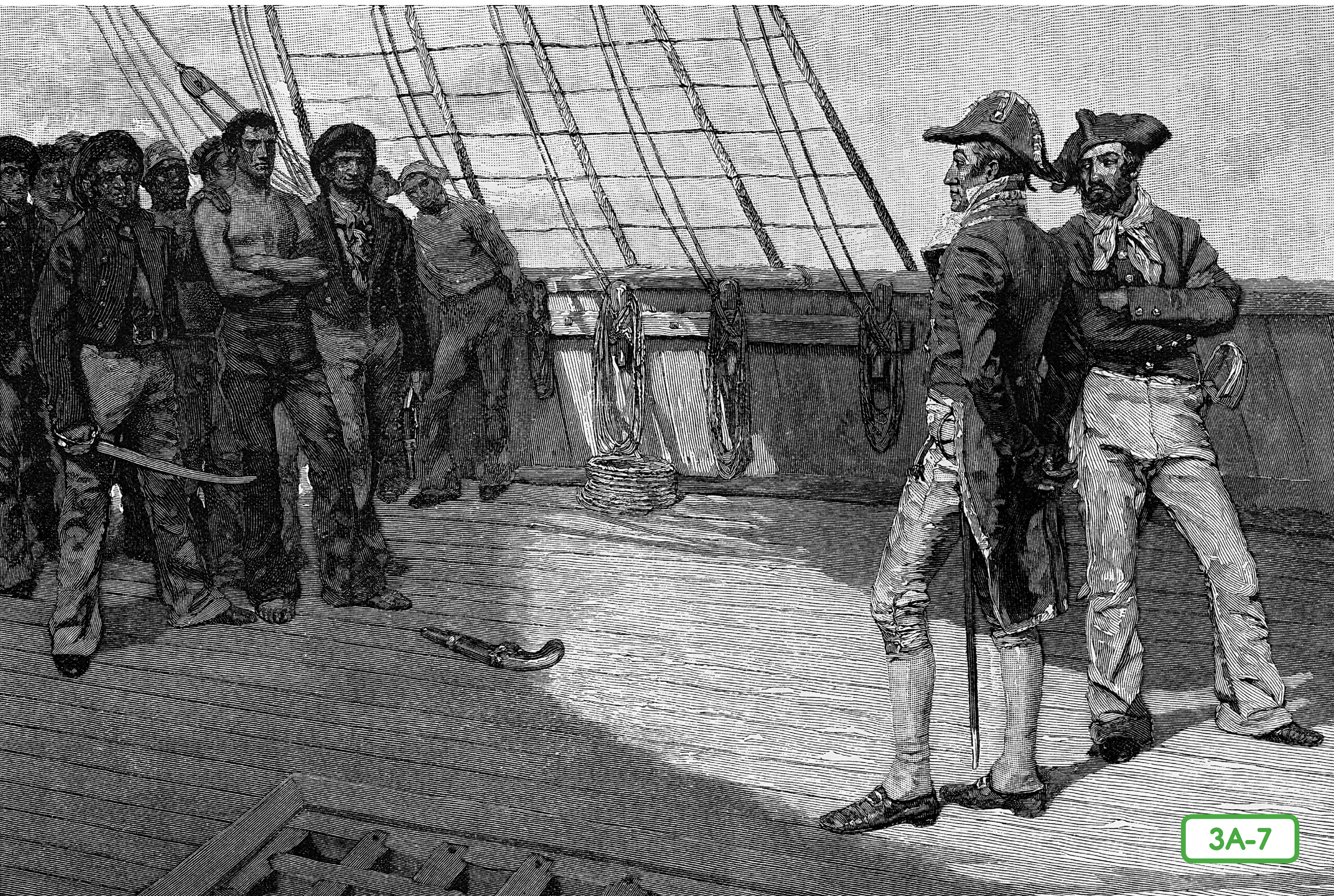


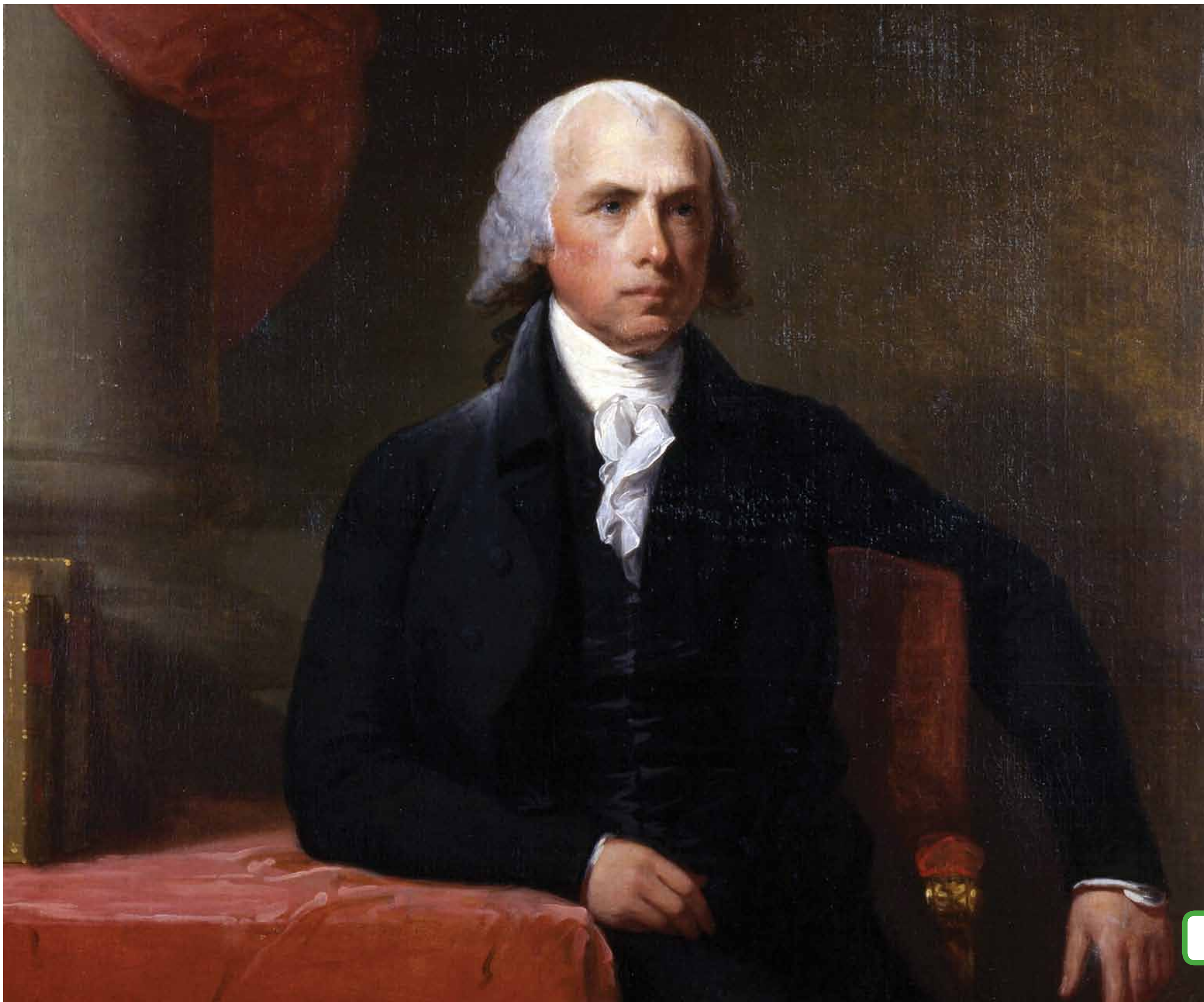






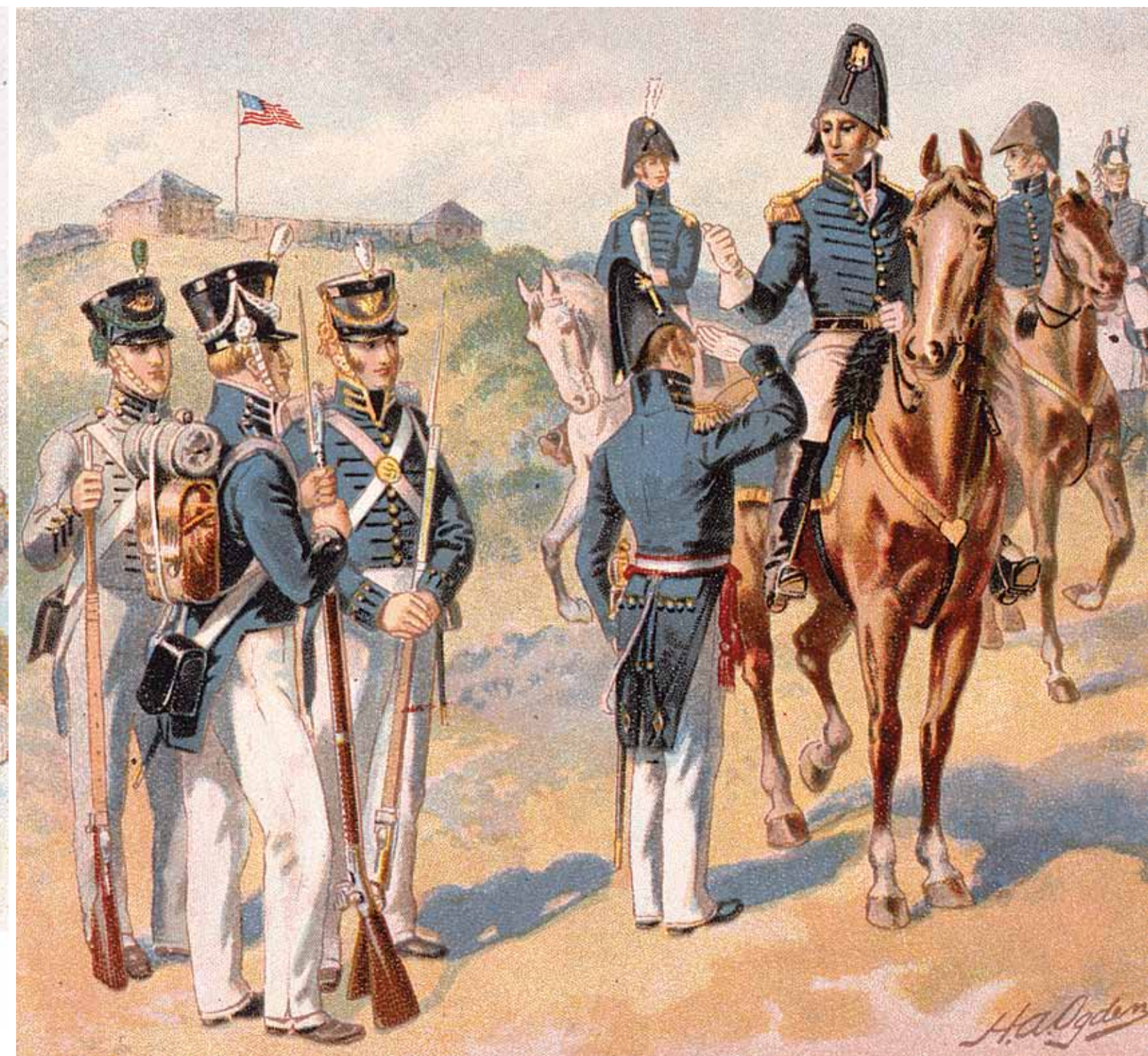
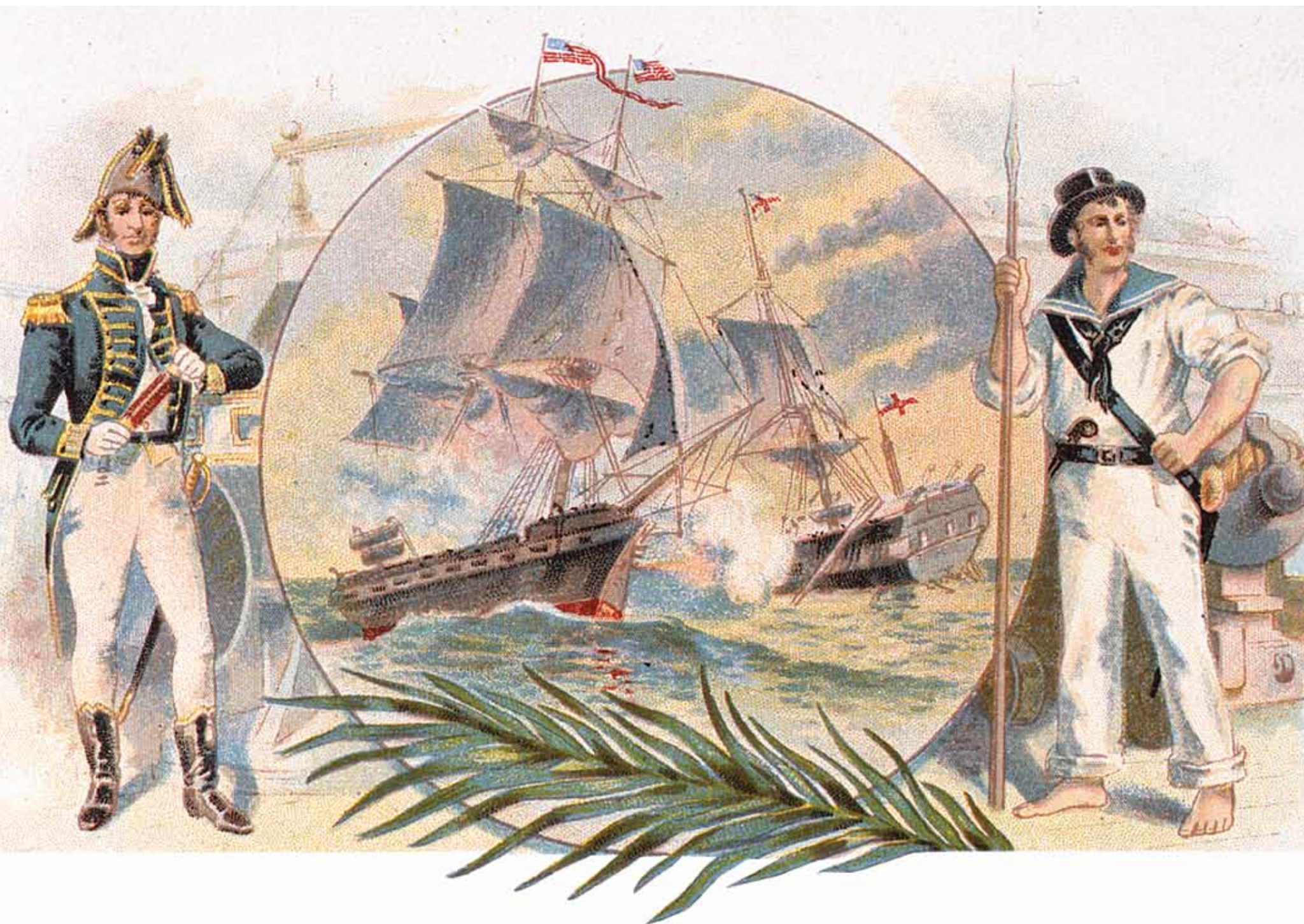




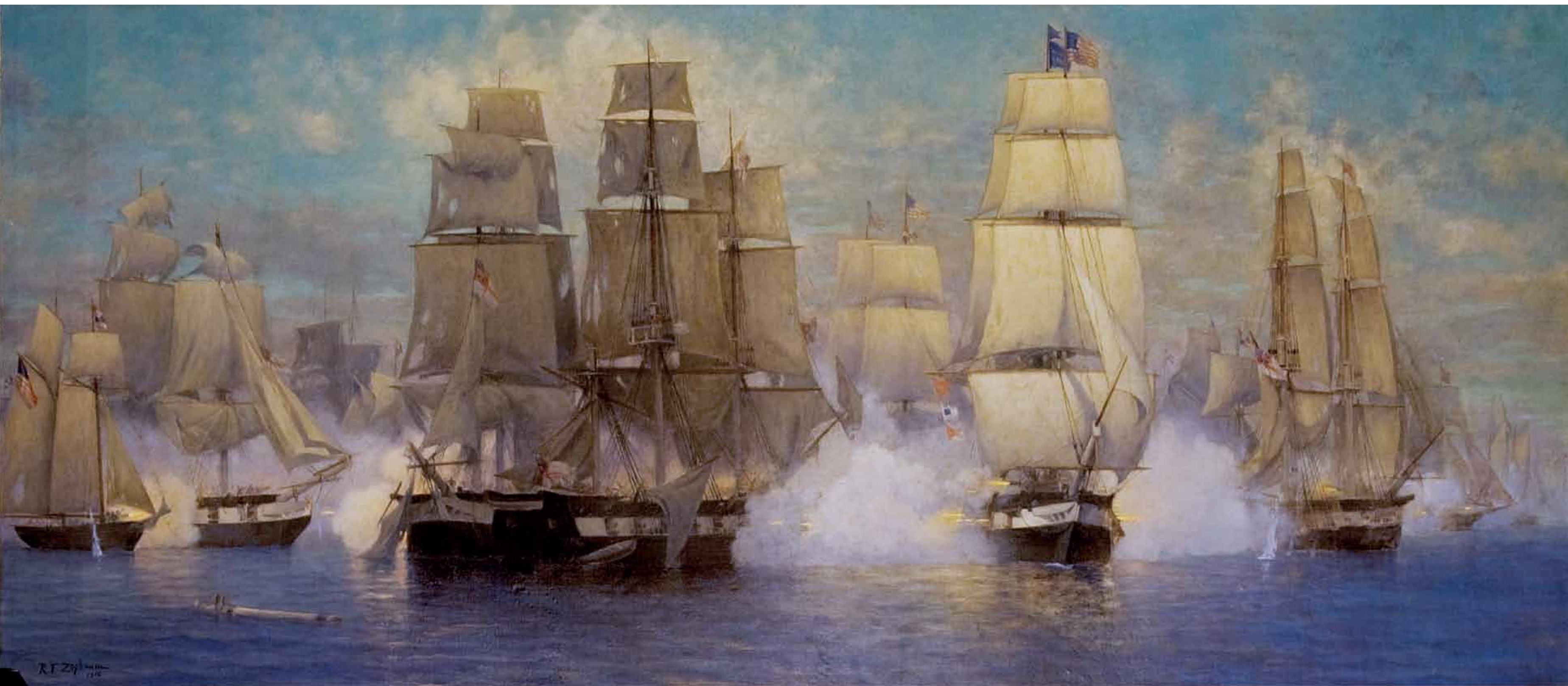
















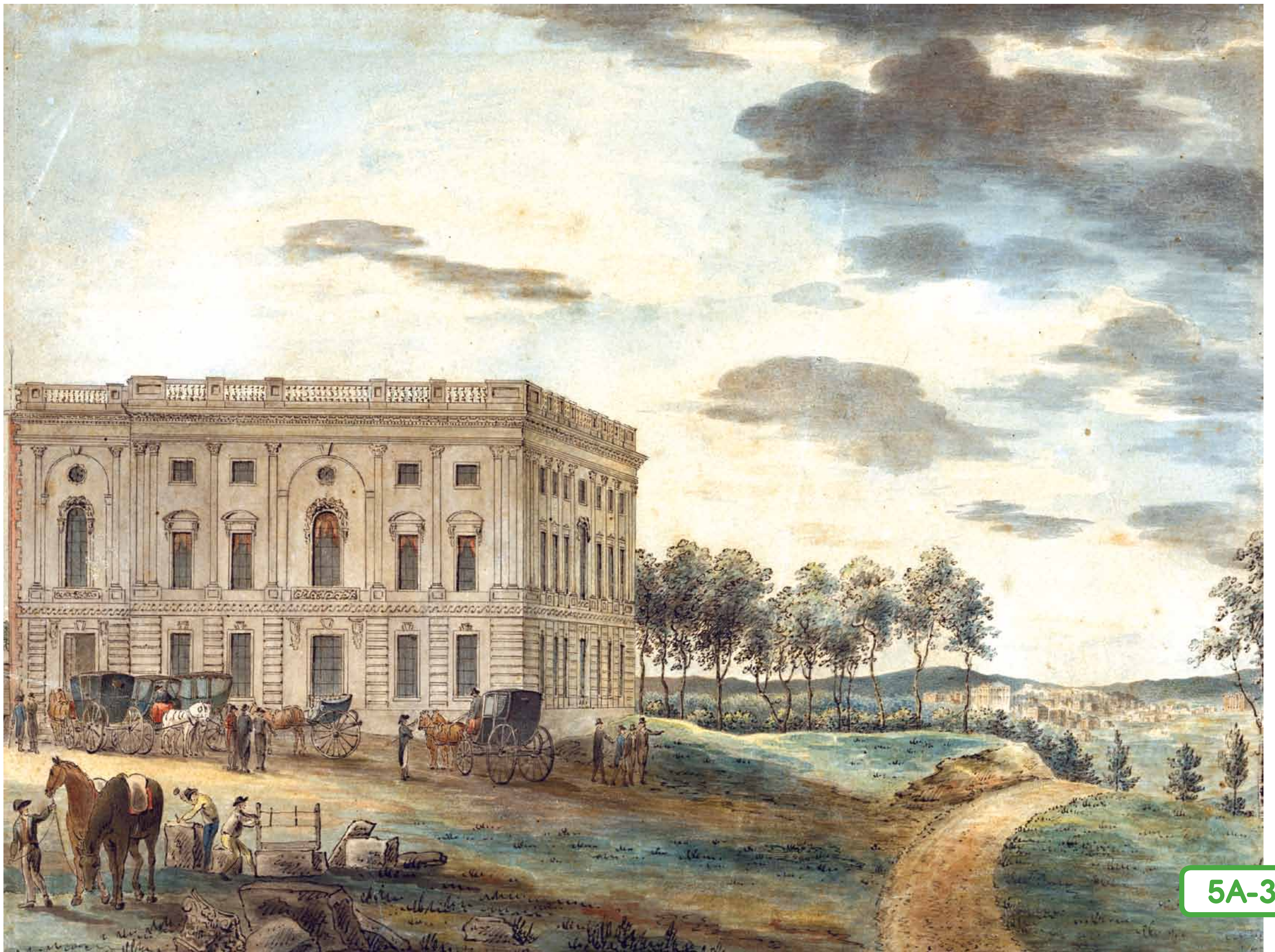








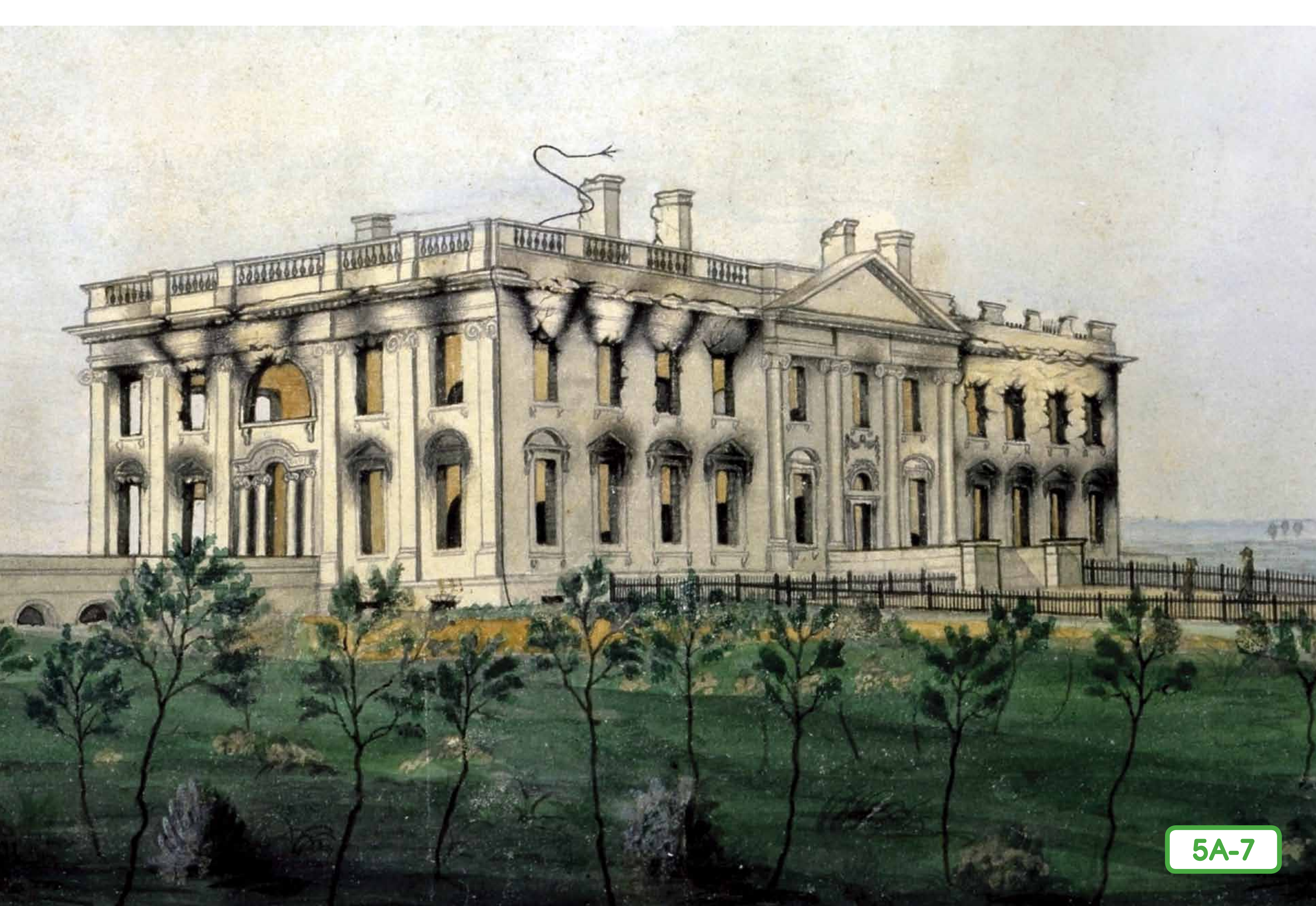


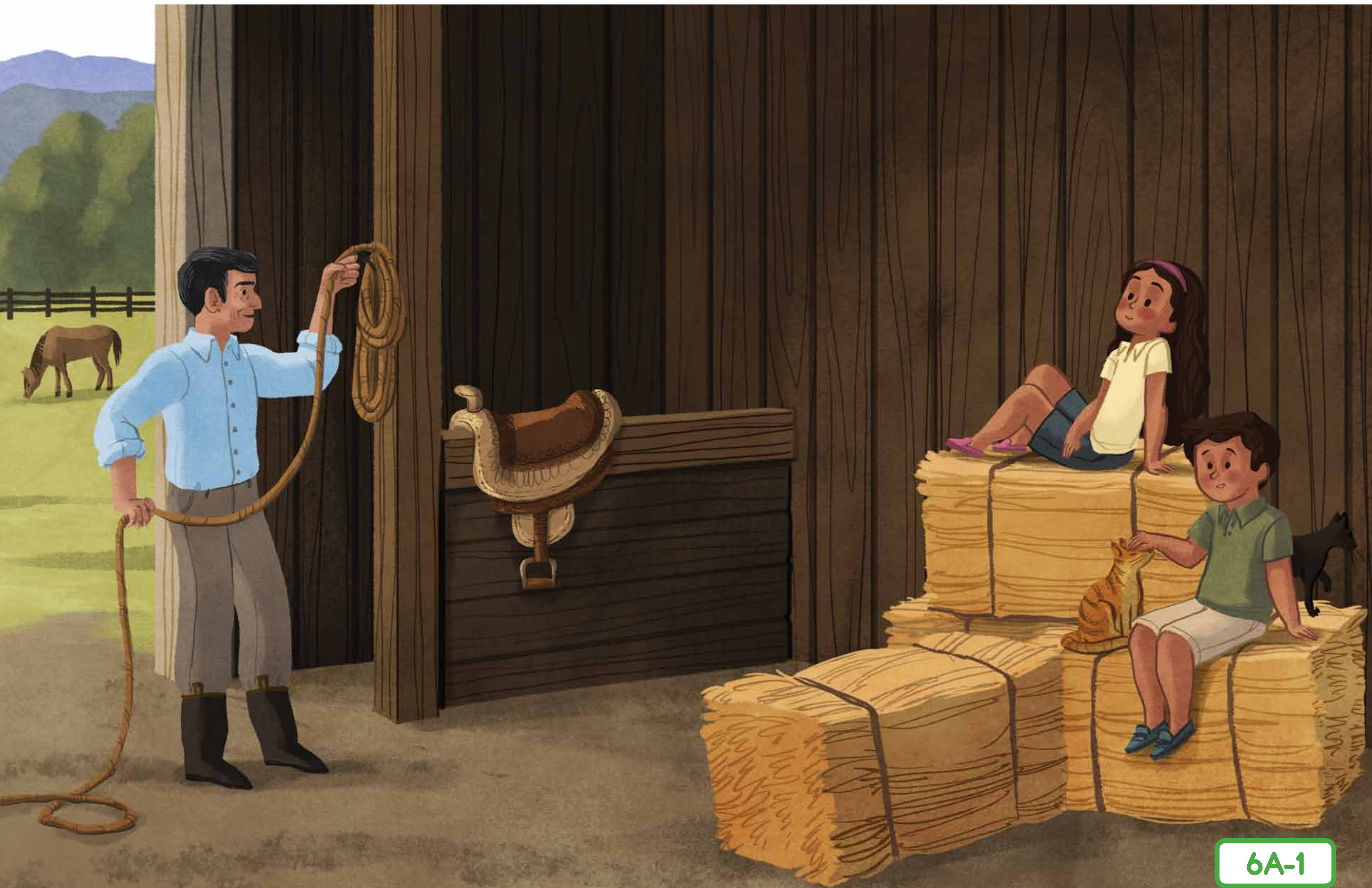












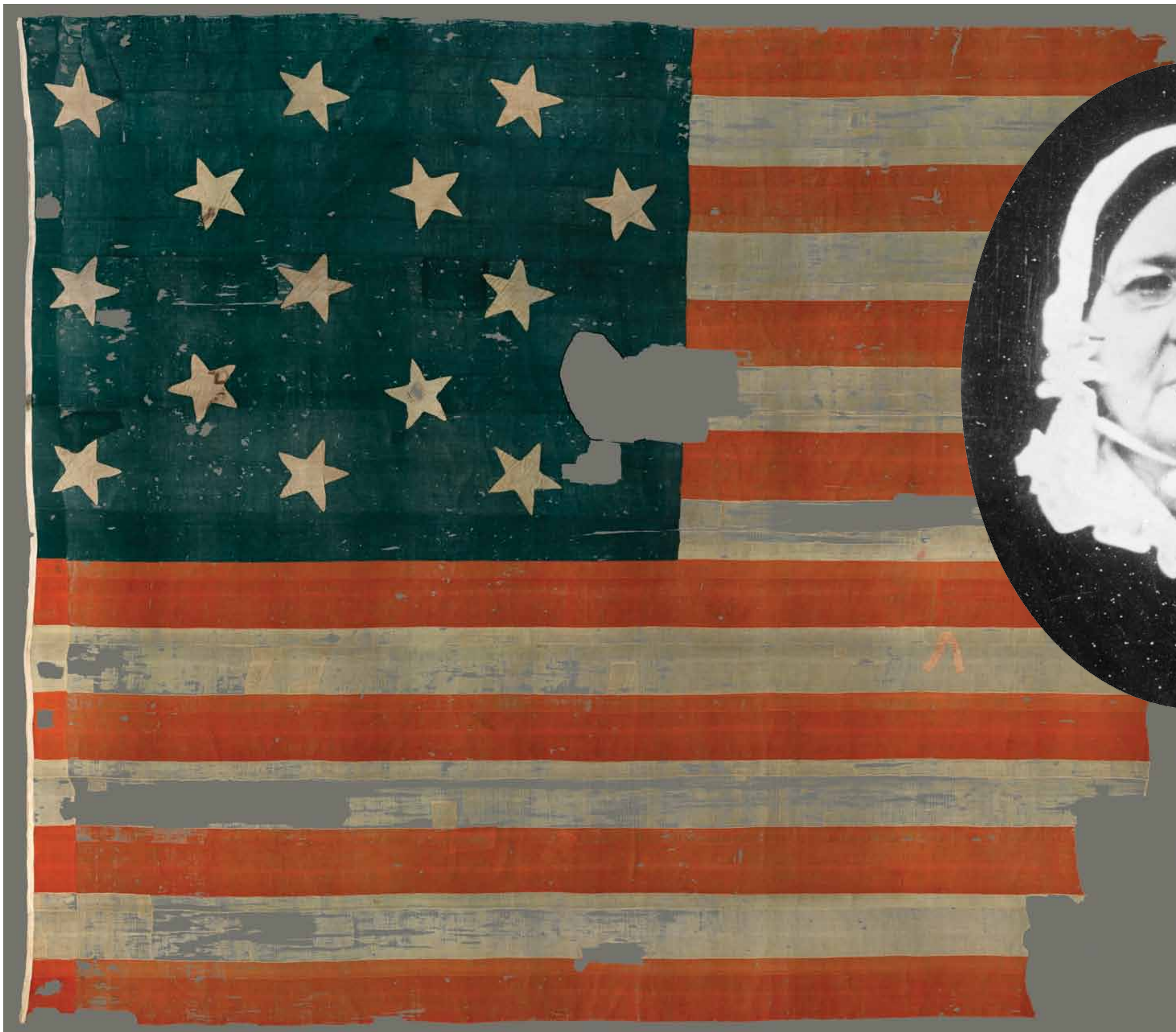




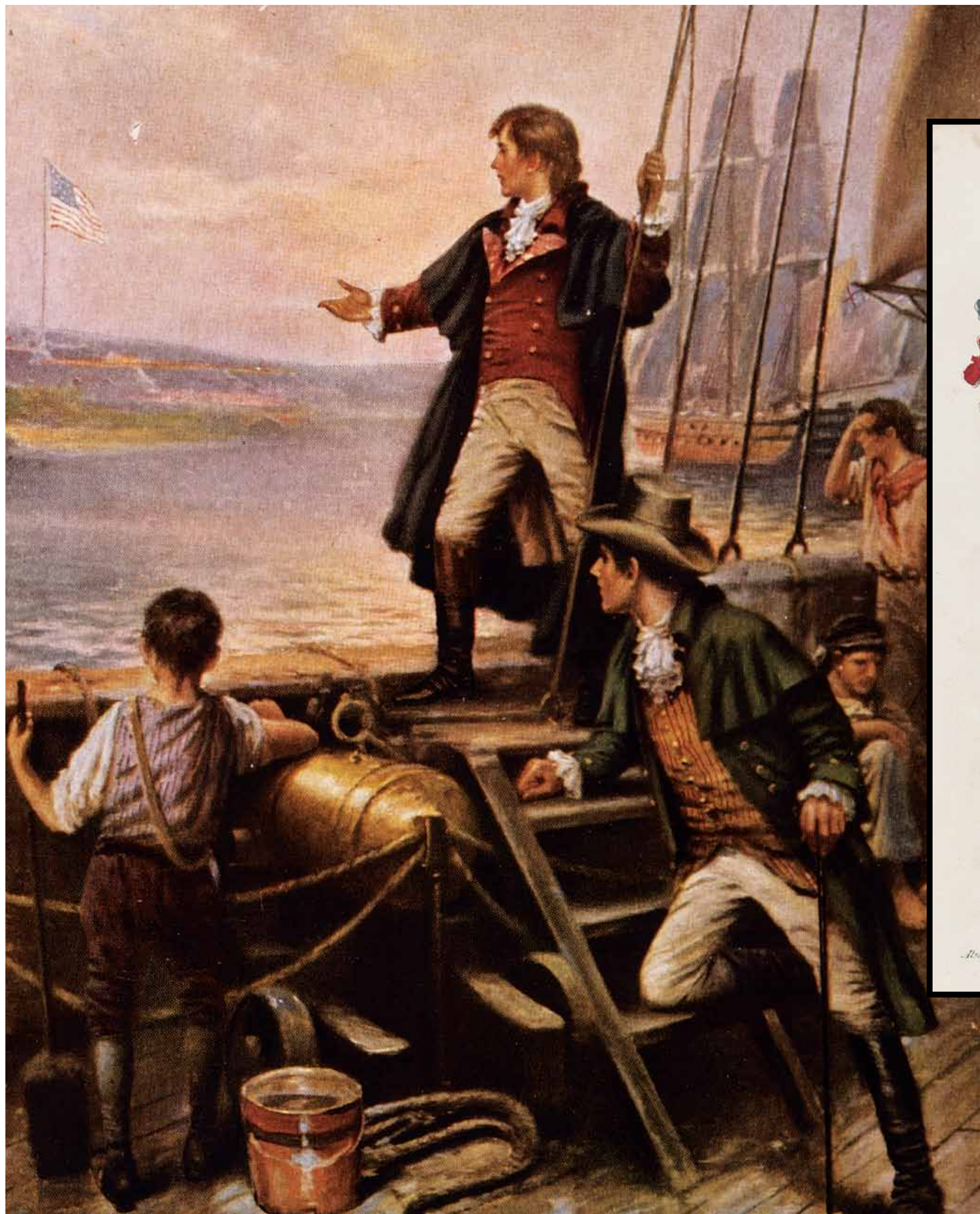

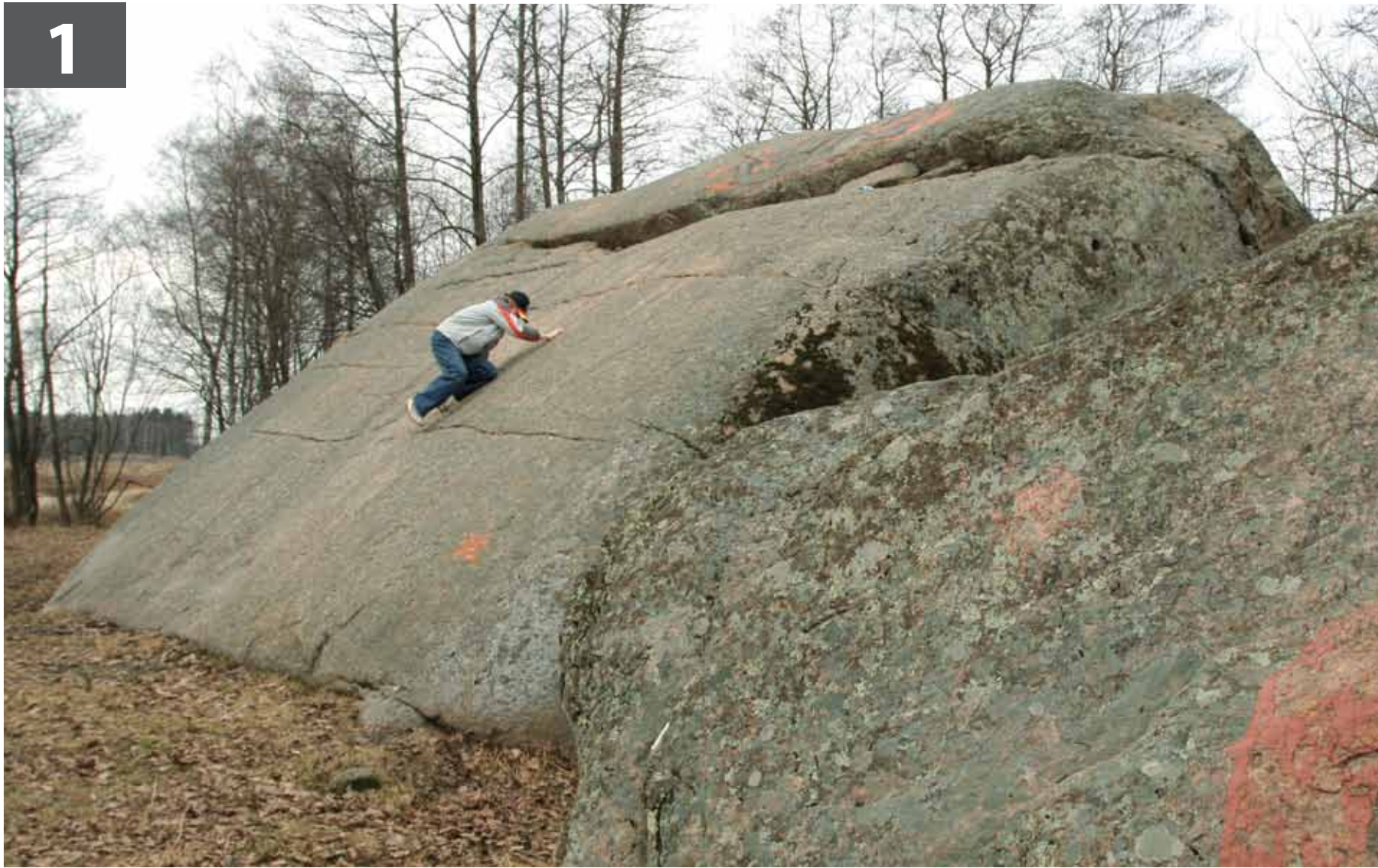


Beat (Poster 3M)
