**Linguistic Demands:** The following are examples in English that may vary based on the language of instruction. In the first three levels (entering, emerging and transitioning), students can approach these linguistic demands in the new and/or home language.

Identify characteristics of storybooks (e.g., books that tell a story), poems (e.g., a short story with rhyming words) and songs (e.g., has music).
