Linguistic Demands: The following are examples in English that may vary based on the language of instruction. In the first three levels (entering, emerging and transitioning), students can approach these linguistic demands in their new and/or home language.

- Recognize a favorite author and some of his/her books (e.g., Eric Carle, *Animals, Animals* [1999]; *Brown Bear, Brown Bear, What Do You See?*[1996]; *1,2,3 on the Zoo* [1996]).
- Use sentence structures to express an opinion (e.g., I like ___ because ___; I don't like it because ___; we read about ___).
